The Color of Water by James McBride

Claudette Clovin: Twice Toward Justice by Phillip Hoose

ASSIGNMENT #1: Complete a dialectical journal for the book of your choice. The journal will be due in September. Guidelines for the journal are provided with this assignment.

ASSIGNMENT #2: Upon your return to school in September, you will be given an essay prompt related to your chosen book.

Due Dates:

1. The summer reading assignments are due on the third day the class meets in September with the exception of seventh block classes (seventh block -- due on the sixth day the class meets). *All written work must be typed double-spaced, using 12 point Times New Roman font.*
